HIV Data Systems Summary Aaron D. Peterson

Three Main Systems for Tracking HIV Testing and Services

eHARS

- eHARS stands for Enhanced HIV/AIDS reporting system.
- It is the system used for HIV surveillance.
 - o This is why you may hear eHARS data and surveillance data used interchangeably.
- eHARS collects data on all people living with HIV (PLWH) in Minnesota.
- The following data is collected:
 - o Name
 - o Demographic information
 - o Viral loads
 - o CD4 counts
 - Others (but less relevant to this summary)

CAREWare

- CAREWare is an electronic health and social support services information system for Ryan White clients in Minnesota.
- With few exceptions, Ryan White clients are HIV positive.
- In 2016, 4313 people were Ryan White clients in Minnesota.¹
 - o Roughly half of the PLWH in Minnesota.
- This system contains:
 - o Client names
 - Complete and thorough demographics
 - o Services provided via Ryan White
- All Ryan White clients in CAREWare are in eHARS.

EvaluationWeb

- All Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) funded HIV tests are entered into EvaluationWeb (sometimes shortened to EvalWeb).
- There are roughly 15,000 HIV tests conducted annually through MDH funded sites.
- Both positive and negative tests are entered into EvalWeb.
- No names are associated with EvalWeb, so we cannot determined if a person living with HIV had MDH funded tests done in the past.
- EvalWeb does capture some demographic information.
 - o <Will ask MDH to find out what demographic information>

¹ To be precise, Minnesota CAREWare also includes 2 counties in Wisconsin that are part of the Minneapolis-St. Paul metro area.
