

Prevention with Positives

CDC Definition: The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends prevention with positives (PWP) for people living with HIV as part of the high impact prevention strategy (HIP), that is a re-enforcement of treatment as prevention (TasP) that is aimed at reducing new infections.

Key components include:

- Increase linkage to care
- Increase re-engagement to care
- Support treatment adherence
- Risk reduction- condoms, safer sex practices
- Partner engagement for HIV negative: to increase HIV testing and PrEP
