- Suggested options for location:
  - Clare Housing, which has multiple locations (5)

    - Important for community engagement
    - Many Ryan White clients live in Clare Housing
  - Health Services Building (HSB) in downtown Minneapolis
  - Hennepin County Libraries
    - Uptown
    - Downtown
    - Free parking
    - Homeless go to libraries
  - o Park and Recreations- Loring Park
    - Community space in a house

#### IV. Council Reflectiveness Discussion

- Stephen informed the committee that the Membership and Training Committee is considering changing the way it tracks council member reflectiveness. Stephen asked for the committee's feedback on adding a "multi-racial" category to the reflectiveness grid.
- Jeremy displayed a *Draft Reflectiveness Grid* with multiple options for categorizing race.
- Alejandro suggested that the Membership and Training Committee should utilize "Latinx" rather than "Hispanic" because it is more inclusive.
- Joe suggested that the Membership and Training Committee should consider using data visualizations to better show the data.
- Tyrie and Alejandro indicated that they preferred option three, which is to double count race because it accurately reflects what race people consider themselves to be.
  - o Alejandro noted that RFPs typically do not target multi-racial groups, so we would need to consider that if we switch to multi-racial categorization.
