



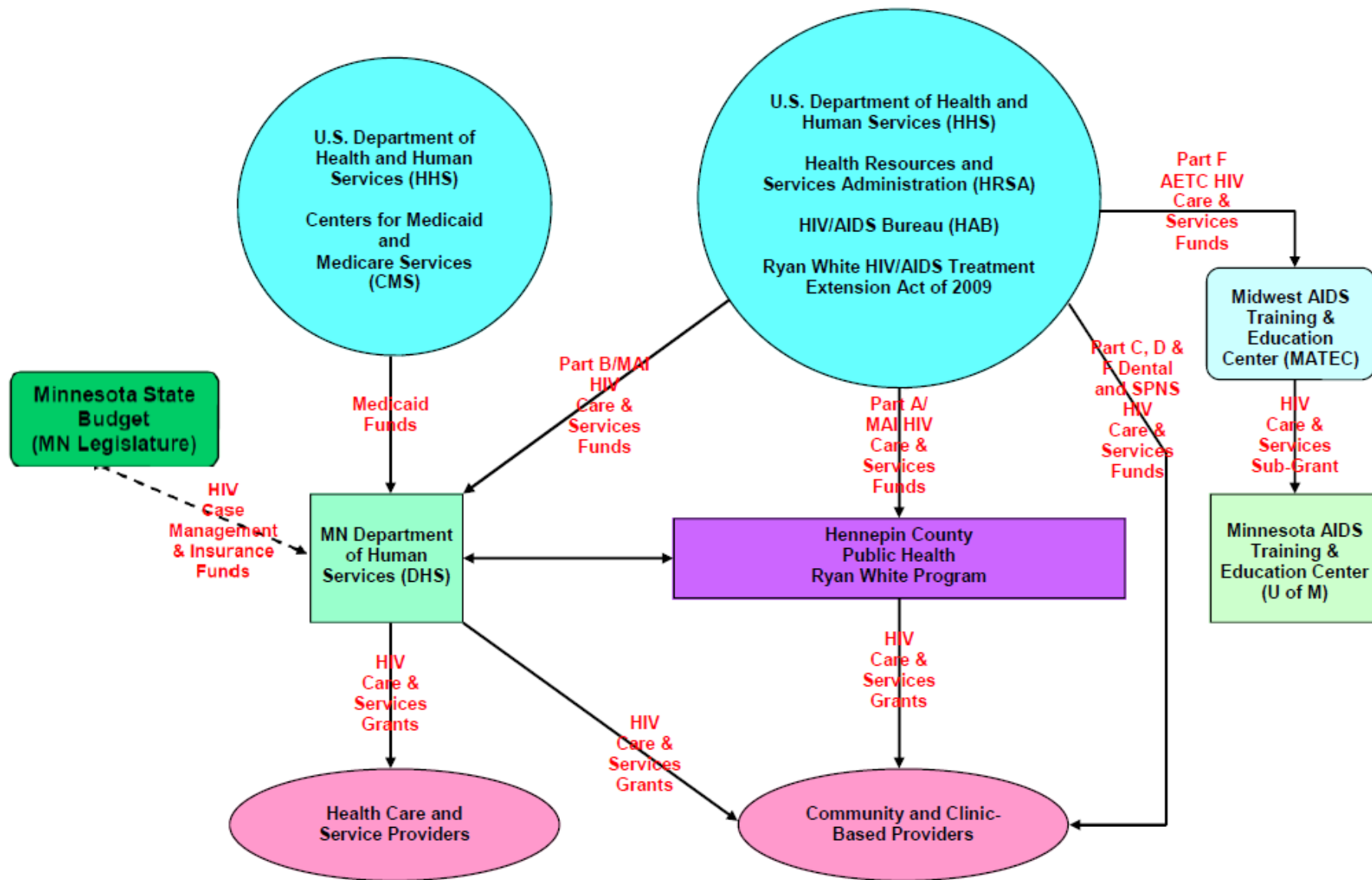

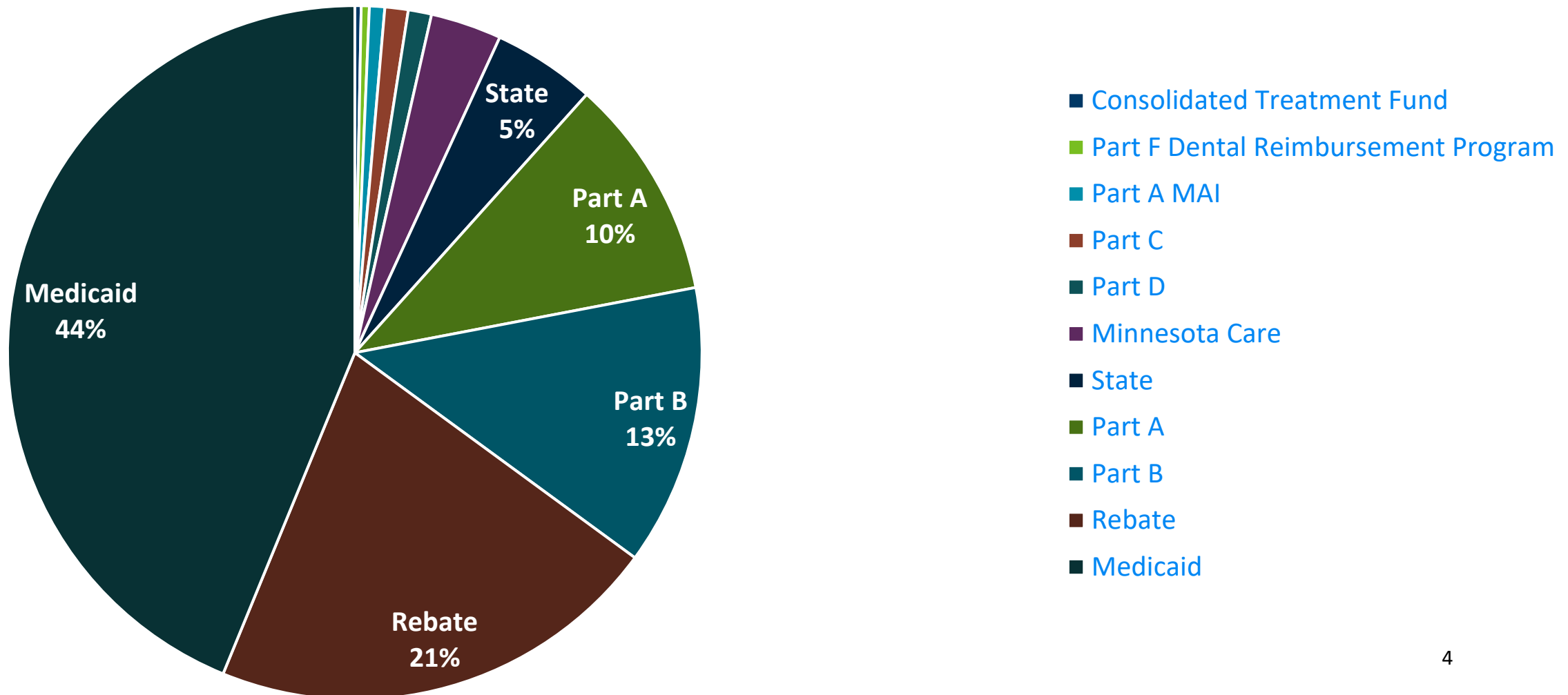

Publicly funded program amounts for people with HIV in Minnesota (FY 2021)

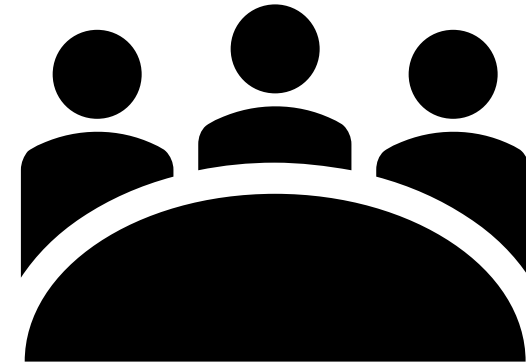

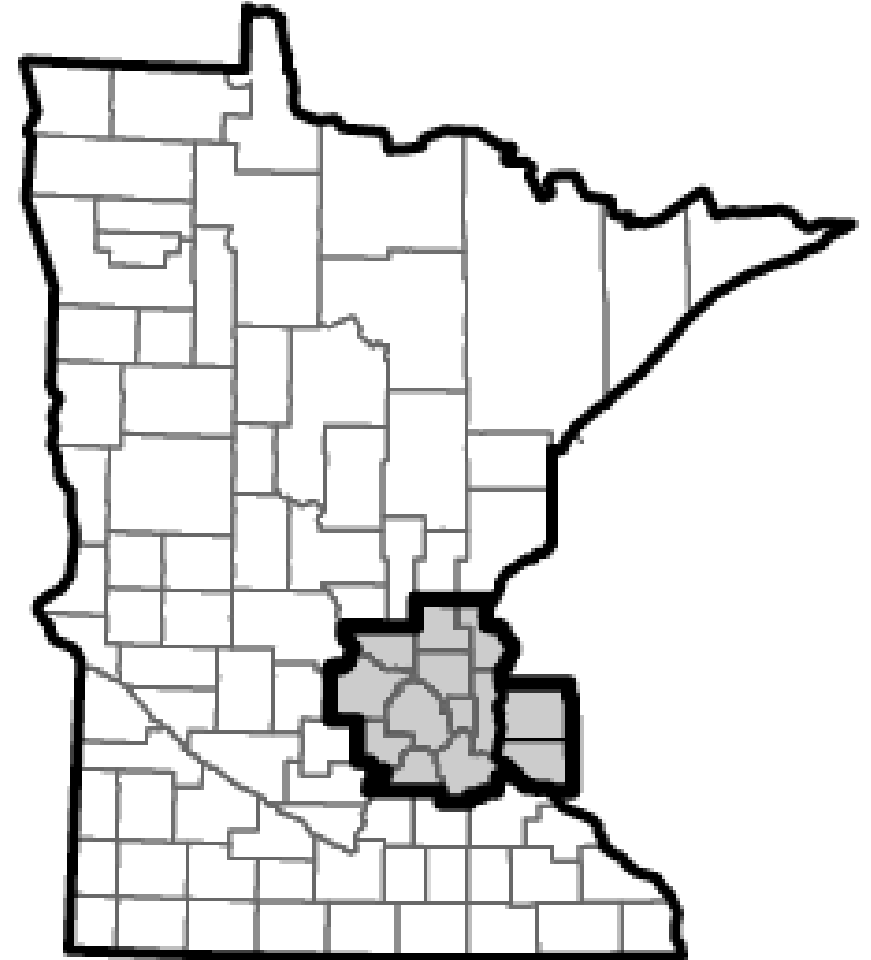


HIV Specific Funding Sources

- The Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Part A funds grants to Eligible Metropolitan Areas (EMAs) and Transitional Grant Areas (TGAs) that are most affected by the HIV epidemic.



- The Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program (RWHAP) Part B provides grants to states and territories to improve HIV health care and support services.
 - These improvements relate to quality, availability, and organization.





Minority AIDS Initiative (MAI)

- Funding streams include:
 - Part A
 - Provides core medical and related support services to improve access and reduce disparities in health outcomes in metropolitan areas hardest hit by HIV/AIDS.
 - Part B
 - Funds outreach and education services designed to increase access for people who identify in minority populations to needed HIV/AIDS medications.

AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP)

- Provides FDA-approved medications to low-income people with HIV who have limited or no health coverage from private insurance, Medicaid, or Medicare.
- Grant recipients can also use ADAP funds to:
 - Buy health insurance for eligible clients
 - Provide services that improve access to, adherence to, and monitoring of, drug treatments.





Other Funding Sources to Be Aware Of

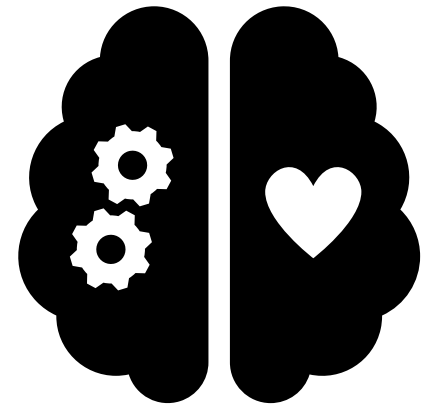


Medicaid and Minnesota Care

- Medicaid (Medical Assistance - MA)
 - Comprehensive health care for people with incomes up to 133% FPG (single adults)
 - Outpatient and inpatient medical care
 - Behavioral health services (mental health and chemical health services)
 - Dental care
- Minnesota Care
 - Comprehensive health care for people with incomes up to 200% FPG (single adults)
 - Health and behavioral health similar to MA
 - Limited dental care

Consolidated Treatment Fund

- Chemical health treatment for people with substance use disorders
 - Inpatient and outpatient treatment depending on assessment
 - Medication assisted therapy
- Income eligibility limits similar to MA



Private Health Insurance

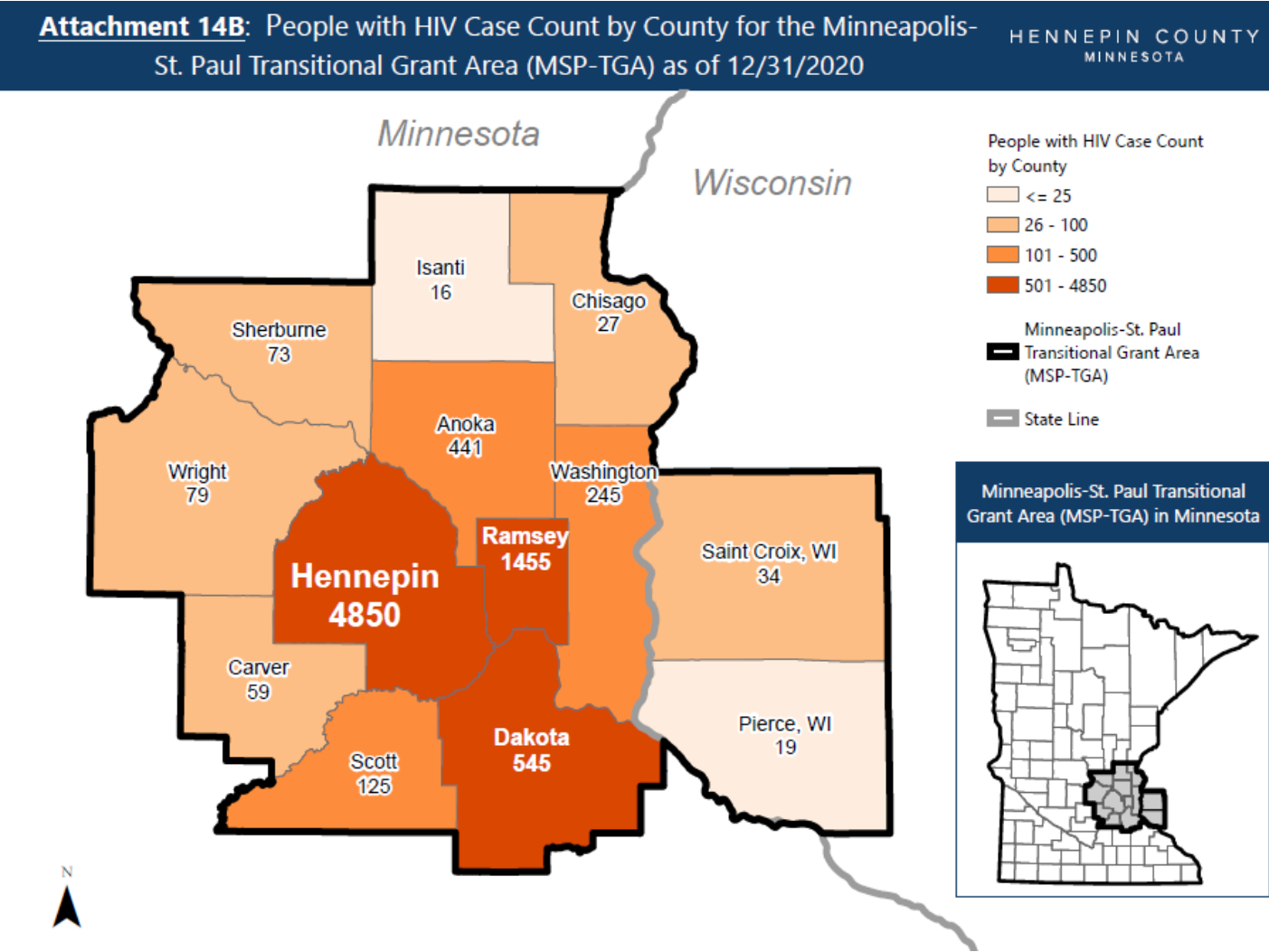
- Employer sponsored or individual
 - Outpatient and inpatient medical care
 - Behavioral health services
 - Oral health (if offered by employer or purchased by individual)
 - Individual plans obtained through *MNSure* or off-exchange market



Funding Source Geography

Hennepin County

- Serves: Minneapolis- St. Paul Transitional Grant Area
 - Minnesota: Anoka, Carver, Chisago, Dakota, Hennepin, Isanti, Scott, Ramsey, Sherburne, Washington, Wright
 - Wisconsin: Pierce, St. Croix
- Funding sources:
 - Part A
 - Part A Minority AIDS Initiative (MAI)





MN Department of Human Services

- Serves: State of Minnesota
 - Includes the Minnesota counties of the Minneapolis-St. Paul Transitional Grant Area (MSP-TGA).
 - Greater Minnesota can only be served by these funding sources.
- Funding sources:
 - Part B
 - Part B Minority AIDS Initiative (MAI)
 - Part B Supplemental
 - ADAP
 - Rebate
 - State
